For engagement of Statutory Auditor we invited NIQ vide No 04/WBFBCP-2019-20 dated 27.05.2019 for the F.Y. 2018-19. Accordingly 16 (sixteen) bids were received which were evaluated by a technical committee constituted for the purpose. Out of

- vi) NITI Aayog approved the PPR vide their memo no. M-11012/13/2019-SJE dated 8th September, 2019.
- vii) DEA also approved the PPR in their 97th Meeting of Screening Committee vide agenda item no 20.4 held on 16.07.2019
- viii) The under Secretary to the Govt. of India, DEA has also informed vide letter no. 1/19/2018-Japan (P&P) dated 19.08.2019 that "West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Project- Phase-II" has been included in the JICA rolling plan for ODA loan.

7. JICA India Mission's field visit and observation

A JICA team consisting of Mr. Toru Umechi, Senior Representative, Mr. V.Sarin Addl. Chief Development Specialist and Ms. Sayaka Ochida, Programme Specialist, JICA India Office made a field visit from 3rd-6th June, 2019 to study the progress of work under WBFBC Project.

The summary of discussions and site visit observations is furnished below:-

- Plantation works:- The mission visited a number of plantations covering various models under the project. Generally, it was observed that the plantations have been carried out in a very well planned manner. The growth was observed to be good and the survival rate seemed to be high. The e-plantation journals were meticulously prepared and available in all sites. It needs to be noted that good quality planting material raised in the project Hi-tech Central Nurseries by WBFD, have credibly contributed to better growth rate/ survival of the plantations. This deserves to be appreciated.
- ii) **Hi-Tech Central Nurseries:** The Mission visited two Hi-Tech nurseries during visit at Bagora and Rimbik. The nurseries were observed to be well planned comprising mist chambers, raised beds with structures for shade for cloth (agronets), root trainers (hycopot) which not only facilitate raising of good quality material but also help in effectively containing environmental pollution by doing away with the conventional practice of using non-reusable poly bags for raising the saplings.
- community Development Infrastructure:- The JFMCs visited by the Mission had utilised had utilised the project funds for construction of CDI which ranged from extension of existing community building to micro irrigation facilities, water supply, construction of cemented paths/culverts, installation of solar street lights, installation of solar powered fencing etc. The JFMC members seemed satisfied and happy with the CDI works carried out in their villages.
- Self Help Groups (SHGs) and Income Generation Activities (IGAs):- Under each JFMC, at least two SHGs are receiving support under the project. The membership ranges from 10 to 15 in each SHG and each member is engaged in individual activity. The Mission has suggested to follow few steps i.e. Selection of Model SHG, establishing challenge fund, preparation of formats for maintaining records, preparation of hand book on "Good Practices" for information dissemination to other SHGs etc. for giving impetus to the SHGs/IGAs
- Micro- Plan: The Mission has suggested to prepare Micro-Plan both in English and Bengali Language for the better understanding and ownership of the JFMC members.

PMU has initiated steps to comply with the observations of JICA-India mission. This is for information of G.B. members only.

9. Overseas Study Tour:-

Capacity building and institutional development is one of the project components of JICA assisted West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Project (WBFBCP) implemented by West Bengal Forest Department (WBFD). Accordingly, project provides overseas training of senior, middle and junior officers upto the rank of Range officers. Four overseas training programme with 29 participating officers (out of total target of 60) have been successfully conducted till date.

During last F.Y. year two overseas study tour and training programme have been successfully completed.

- Training on Carbon Forestry at the Institute of Forest Sciences, Freiburg University, Germany from 17th February to 9th March, 2019 in which two officers participated in the training course.
- ii) Study tour on Wildlife Management, Biodiversity Conservation and Park Management Issues with focus on Human Elephant Conflict Management in Sri Lanka from 20th January to 3rd February, 2019 in which 10 (ten) officers participated in the study tour.
